HOW TO GO GREEN

As the heat index rises we're all tempted to turn up our ac units. Here are a few tips on keeping cool during the hotter months without breaking the bank!

- 1.** In the warm weather, turn the thermostat on your ac unit to 78 degrees. Each degree above 75° saves you 3% of the energy used to cool your home. This will allow for a cool environment without using too much power. When away from your home or office for long periods, either switch off your ac unit or turn the temperature up to 83 – 85 degrees. This uses even less power while you are away.
- 2.** Clean the filter of your ac unit. The dirtier your filter, the harder, and more power your unit will use to pull in and cool air. Check your filter every month and replace as necessary.
- 3.** Use ceiling fans or other fans to cool your home. The blowing air can make you feel 5 degrees cooler, without running your ac unit. Fans use a lot less electricity than air conditioners.
